Next FCC License Examinations On December 10th

CVARC hosts FCC License Examinations at 8:30 AM on the second Sunday of even numbered months at the Ventura East County Sheriff Station on Olsen Rd. (near the Reagan Library). The next exams will be held on Sunday morning December 10th. CVARC conducts exams for all license classes. Exam candidates must bring a form of government issued photo I.D., the original AND a photocopy of any existing license or Certificate of Exam Element Completion, a Social Security (or government issued Taxpayer I.D.) number, and \$14 ARRL VE Exam fee (cash is preferred). No advance reservation is necessary, walk-ins are welcome. Advance notice is needed for special circumstances, such as reading the exam to sight-impaired candidates. data on members' interests, but we did not subsequently do very much with it. I'm still of the opinion that it is good for the Board of Directors to have a good measure of the interests of *all* of the members, so I may dust off the questionnaire again in the coming year. If nothing else, it would be nice to rate past club meeting presentations so that we know what sort of speakers to invite in future.

It is tempting to forget *entirely* the less successful projects. The Young Ham Sessions attracted little interest. A weekly CVARC net on the local repeater had few participants. Similarly, a CW practice net had few takers. The "For Sale and Wanted" section on the Yahoo Group spluttered and died. The "Every Member on the Air" program did not really take off. The "Worked all CVARC" award remained unclaimed. I'm expecting that, for every one of these, someone will take me aside and say "did you *have* to mention that in the newsletter". I see things a bit differently though. To me it is a very good sign that, as a club, we are willing to risk trying new things. It is not always obvious when something will be a hit. A good example for me was the 2005 Holiday Auction, which was originally envisioned as a minor diversion but turned out to be a major part of the party fun, as well as being very successful as a fundraiser.

So, looking forward, I do hope that we will continue to be open to trying new ideas. Already there is talk about more joint activities with other local clubs. A camping trip has been suggested. Several people have said that they'd like to see more social activities. And although I will not be club President, I do plan to be an active member. So I'd like to take this opportunity to say "thank you" to everybody who has been so supportive of the job of President over the last couple of years. And I'd like to wish you and your families a happy and prosperous coming year.
